The following matters were raised:

- Congratulations to Jon-Ross Hill, Ian Ramsey, Jacob Posa and Kevin Baylis who recently

  Institute. A special mention was given to Jacob for achieving outstanding results.
- A study group, facilitated by Andrew Liew, is currently underway. These workshops have been run previously and are very beneficial to members preparing to sit exams. Anyone interested in joining this study group can find details on the PINZ website.
- Thanks to all members that replied to the recent expressions of interest circulation. A positive response has been received regarding a Plant & Machinery Valuers Institute Conference to be scheduled for 17 November 2022 in Auckland (venue TBA). The programme will comprise speakers presenting on topics dedicated to plant and machinery with a networking dinner on the 16 November or the evening of the conference. The CPD points available for this event are to be confirmed.
- The PINZ Rule of a three year term limit for the Plant & Machinery Valuers Institute Chair
  was raised. A robust discussion on this matter was held and it was agreed that this rule was
  not practical for the PMVI Council due to the very small pool it had to call upon. It was
  therefore decided that a proposal to amend this rule be prepared for presenting to the PINZ
  Board.
- The Chair thanked David Baxter and Murray Rendle for keeping the Plant & Machinery Valuers Institute abreast of standards in their additional roles as representatives on the Property & Valuation Standards Board. David has recently retired from this Board and has assumed a role on the Life Committee Panel.
- It was highlighted that the carry over of CPD points for NZIV members had been reinstated starting January 2023 and the NZIV CPD Policy updated. No changes are required to the PINZ CPD Policy as the ability to carry over points has always been available to members of PINZ.
